Our Academies

Market Field School, is a special day school, based in Colchester. The school supports over 370 children, aged 4—16 with moderate learning difficulties.

The school also links with **Market Field College** which is based in Clacton and has roughly 130 pupils.

Southview School was the next school to join the Trust in 2018. The school is based in Witham and supports over 130 students from ages 3—19 with physical and neurological impairments.

Recently, Southview has opened a brand new college facility which has residential capacity to teach and support the pupils to live independently.





Chatten Free School is based in Witham was built by Hope Learning Community Trust in 2021. It was the second school to join the Trust. The school is the only one of its kind and supports over 70 children who are severely affected by autism and associated learning difficulties.

Lexden Springs School is the most recent academy to join the Trust in January 2025. The school caters for pupils aged 3 – 19 who have complex learning difficulties (profound and multiple learning difficulties and severe learning difficulties) and those on the Autistic spectrum continuum. The school also has a residential facility.
